
South Queensferry course 7 routechoice analysis

An interesting leg with 3 options. Right and left both about the same distance with middle being a bit longer but left has some twisty step in tight alleyways so might be a bit slower. Apologies for #2 being slightly in the wrong place, I only found out that the fence had fallen down on Thursday, hope it didn't affect anyone's race!




A complex routechoice leg with 3 options, and it will have been hard to evaluate after two twisty, execution based legs before it. Right (green) is the shortest but middle (blue), is only 4m longer so both are good options. Right (red) is a bit too long, you'd probably lose a few seconds picking this route.




Three choices on this leg again, the middle route (red) is marginally shorter than right (purple) with left (green) being quite a lot longer than both of them.




Not very important which route you pick on this leg, just need to execute it well.



A very decisive routechoice leg here. Right (green) is a huge 70m shorter than right (red), the chicane around the hedge just adds too much distance on this route.




My favourite leg of the course. It comes after a few transitional execution style legs so you hopefully had enough time to evaluate the routechoices. Having a barrier on the hedge next to #27 creates a really interesting feature that makes the right route much longer than it otherwise would've been. A few seconds gained for going left I would say.




Just a 50/50, but maybe tough to judge straight after the map flip. Potentially slightly quicker to go left due to the grass being slippy on the right (green) choice



More use of the elongated hedge feature. Right is shorter but not significantly so, and left has less tight turns and the opportunity to get up to speed so the two routes are probably about the same time wise.



A 50/50, the steps down from the retaining wall on the right routechoice are quite awkward so left is probably slightly quicker.



One last use of the hedge to create a nice leg here. Left 10m shorter, not completely decisive, but definitely worth a couple of seconds.
